When Mary reached the place where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said, "Lord, if you had been here my brother would not have died."

When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled.

"Where have you laid him?" he asked.

"Come and see, Lord," they replied.

Jesus wept.

Then the Jews said, "See how he loved him!"

But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind have kept this man from dying?"

Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. "Take away the stone," he said...So they took away the stone. ...Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face. Jesus said to them, "Take off the grave clothes and let him go."

There's a hymn that was written by Frederick Faber in the nineteenth century that begins

Souls of men, why will ye Was there ever kinder

scatter shepherd

Like a crowd of frightened Half so gentle, half so sweet, sheep? As the Saviour who would have

Foolish hearts, why will ye

wander Come and gather round his

From a love so true and deep. feet?

It is true that we are scattered. We can't be with people the way we usually are. But the greater truth is that we can be with friends and

family, neighbours, church family, and work colleagues in more ways than we thought. We can all find some way of keeping on supporting and encouraging one another and looking out for those who may be more vulnerable.

It is true that we may be experiencing fears and anxieties that we've never come up against before, spilling out like napkins from a sprung dispenser. Before we know it, we are overwhelmed. But we can hold on to the greater truth that when we fear we are falling, God is holding on to us. Jesus truly, deeply loves us and nothing can separate us from his love. He is familiar with all our ways and when we seem to be losing our footing he brings us back onto firmer ground. That means keeping our eyes on "whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right." We can take the necessary precautions to keep ourselves and others safe. We can pray. And we can perhaps allow some of the fears and anxieties that have taken a grip on us to be loosened, as we hear Jesus' word, spoken to the friends of Lazarus, spoken to us: "take off the grave clothes and let him go."
